DO I SMELL PROPANE?

Rotten eggs? Sewage? Dead Rodent? Propane?

We have included with your calendar a <u>Propane</u> **Safety** Guide with much useful information, as well as a **Scratch-and-Sniff** odorant circle. Please take time to re-familiarize yourself with the smell of propane odorant. Read carefully the information on what to do if you smell propane, as well as how to turn off the propane supply if you smell the propane odorant. We suggest that you keep this handy guide for easy reference for questions about propane. Our customers health and safety is of utmost importance to **Ressler Propane**. We would also like to call to your attention that a propane flame or pilot can cause a very pungent odor after you have used a petroleum based paint, caulk, stain or polish. This smell will be very much like diesel fumes or kerosene. The odor will only be in the presence of a flame or pilot, and can only be diminished by strong ventilation or extinguishing of the flame. It is important to investigate any unusual or strange odors. Please do not hesitate to call our office if you have any questions or concerns. Our service department will be glad to schedule a complete pressure test of the gas supply system. Again, thanks for being a valued **Ressler Propane** customer.

CARBON MONOXIDE ~ THE SILENT KILLER KNOW THE FACTS

As the days get shorter and the weather gets colder, most of us will be spending more time indoors. As fuel

burning appliances are turned on and fireplaces are lighted, it is important to be aware of the potential hazards of carbon monoxide (CO). It's invisible and it's odorless, yet at high levels, it can be deadly.

What is it? CO is a colorless, odorless, tasteless gas produced by burning fuels such as coal, wood, charcoal, natural gas, propane or oil. Idling cars also produce the gas. If the appliances that burn these fuels are used correctly and are in good working order, the amount of CO produced is not hazardous. However, if appliances are not properly installed or maintained. dangerous levels of CO can occur.

How can CO poisoning be prevented?

- Have your heating system, water heater, and any other gas-, oil-, or coal-burning appliances serviced by a qualified technician every year.
- Install a battery-operated CO detector in your home and check or replace the battery when you change the time on your clocks each spring and fall.
- If your CO detector sounds, evacuate the home immediately and dial 911.
- Seek prompt medical attention if you suspect CO poisoning and are feeling dizzy, light-headed or nauseated.
- Do not use a generator, charcoal grill, camp stove, or other gasoline- or charcoal-burning device inside your home, basement, and garage or near a window.
- Do not run a car or truck inside a garage attached to your house, even if you leave the door open.
- Do not burn any thing in a stove or fireplace that is not vented.
- Do not heat your home with a gas oven.

sea and headaches. Extended exposure may have longer term effects on your health. Moderate levels

can cause severe headaches. nausea. fainting, and mental confusion. Individuals often ignore the symptoms because they are similar to those of the flu or food poisoning. Infants, elderly people, individuals with anemia and those with a history of heart and respiratory disease are particularly susceptible to CO poisoning. If you suspect CO poisoning, get immediately. fresh air Open doors and windows turn off appliances and leave the house. Call 911 or go to an emergency room to report possible poisoning.

drops below 25%, please call our office. This is not a dangerously low level; however, our scheduling department needs to know if your tank needs to be filled earlier than expected. Although 95% of our customers are automatic deliveries, usage amounts can change. Please notify our office if you add gas appliances to the existing propane system at your home or business.
