ENERGY ASSISTANCE THROUGH LIHEAP

With the ever-increasing cost of fuel and energy and fuel, some customers may have difficulty finding the necessary funds to cover the expense of heating their homes. The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a federally funded program that enables the state of Pennsylvania to help low-income households with home heating needs. The program is administered by PA Department of Public Welfare, but is not a public assistance program. It is a grant that does not have to be repaid. Income limits and household size are factors in determining the cash, crisis, and weatherization amounts awarded to households.

To find out if you may qualify for assistance through the program, contact your local Community Action Program (CAP) office or the county assistance office.

BARB RESSLER'S FAVORITE RECIPE CORNER

MARINATED ROAST - ON THE GRILL

3 lb Chuck Roast (1½" - 2" thick)

1/3 c. wine vinegar

1/4 c. ketchup

2 Tbsp salad oil 1 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce 2 Tbsp soy sauce

1 tsp mustard


1 tsp salt

1/4 tsp pepper

1/4 tsp garlic powder



Combine ingredients and marinate roast overnight or at least 8 hours in refrigerator. Grill on low heat for 1-2 hours or until desired tenderness. Slice and serve.





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TIPS TO CONSERVE ENERGY & REDUCE COSTS

- Change furnace filters once a month.
- Have Ressler Propane install a programmable thermostat.
- Close vents and doors in unoccupied rooms as well as dampers on unused fireplaces.
- Lower the thermostat on your water heater to 120 degrees. Consider installing a propane tankless water heater. The cost to operate is about 60% less than electric units.
- Consider having Ressler Propane replace your heating and air conditioning system with higher efficiency equipment. We can help you select a model that best suits your energy needs and your budget.
- Schedule periodic service appointments for your heating and cooling system. This will help to prolong the life of the system as well as keep it operating efficiently. Contact Ressler Propane to schedule maintenance and evaluation of your system.

- Be sure that your basement and attic have the recommended levels of insulation.
- Keep clothes dryer vents clean and free of lint. Restricted air flow causes dryers to use more energy. Propane dryers operate at one half the cost of electric dryers.
